Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper

National Finals at Pennsylvania National

Emily Smith and *Morning De Reve* Jump Won The \$5,000 NAL Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper Final

Emily Smith of Valparaiso, IN and *Morning De Reve*, won the \$5,000 NAL Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper Final at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show.

Smith and *Morning De Reve*, known around the barn as Molly, were the only pair out of a field of 24 to post double clear rounds to take home first place. Four horse-and-rider combinations were able to navigate the first round fault-free and return for the jump-off. Smith and *Morning De Reve* were the last pair to complete the course finishing in 41.283 seconds to clinch the win.

Kelly Tropin of New Canaan, CT rode *Luftzauber*, owned by Libertas Farm LLC, to second place with a faster time of 40.170 seconds but they received 4 faults for knocking down the NAL plank fence mid-way through the course. Third place went to Callie Seaman of Bernardsville, NJ aboard *Heroy Von De Hei* with a time of 43.993 seconds and also with 4 faults.

“She has been amazing,” said Smith about *Morning De Reve*. “Molly is a 10-year-old Irish Sport so I’ve had for just under a year. She is my only horse and she is so special. She is pretty strong and kind of sensitive to ride, you can’t have too much leg, but once she is on her game she is unstoppable. When we get to the jump-off she knows it’s time to shine.

“It was more pressure for me when I found out I could win if I could go clean. It has always been a goal of mine to go to indoors and I’ve watched the NAL classes. Winning one is a dream come true. I’ll be 17 in three days so this kind of a birthday present.”

Smith purchased Molly as her first little junior horse and hoped to move up to the higher levels. It wasn’t her goal to do the NAL Finals, but rather just to progress and move up further. Luckily, not everything goes as planned and she won the NAL Finals.

Dean Dignelli and *Redefin* Won The \$10,000 NAL Adult Jumper Final, Presented by SmartPak

Dean Dignelli, of Katonah, NY and *Redefin* win the \$10,000 NAL Adult Jumper Final, Presented by SmartPak at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show.



“It meant the world to me to win,” said Dignelli. “I just won a National Championship and going from a lunge line to competing here now in just three years, I owe it all to my horse and the whole staff. I think if you work hard and stay focused, good things will happen.”

The top 30 in the nation qualified for the Finals, with eleven going to the jump-off and six going double clear on the Bernardo Cabral-designed course. Dignelli and *Redefin* completed the course in 30.045 seconds.

Phoenix Cook of Chardon, OH and *Skys Burning Blue* took second place with a time of 30.156 and third place went to Joy Slater of Unionville, PA riding *Oilean Uno*, with a time of 31.180.

Dignelli said, “My strategy was just to go as fast as I could and really believe in everything that my coach and uncle, Andre Dignelli, told me. He said to believe in myself, stay focused, execute the plan and not do anything fancy. My brother is unbelievable and I listen to anything he says. I just had faith in my horse and put it in his hands. I just tried to stay tall and stay out of my horse’s way.”

Redefin, owned by Heritage Farm, is a celebrity of his own. He once belonged to Canadian Olympic legend, Ian Millar. “He was Ian’s grand prix horse and he’s been an absolute saint across the board, from grand prix to now teaching and developing me in the adults,” Dignelli explained. “I have owned him for three years; he is the second horse I learned on and he is an unbelievable horse. He doesn’t owe me anything. He is very special to me.”

Dignelli grew up on Heritage Farm but riding didn’t appeal to him at first. “When I finished playing baseball in college, I thought, ‘You know, I think I can do this.’ I got a good feel for it.

“I believed that I had a chance to win,” Dignelli explained. “We’ve qualified the last two years and I always believed in that horse no matter what. I think an advantage I have is to execute and focus on the course and the plan my coaches give because if anyone is going to make a mistake it’s going to be me, not my horse.”

National Finals at Pennsylvania National

Bailey Doloff and *Wishlea Star Dasher* Won The \$10,000 NAL Children's Jumper Final, Presented By EquiFit

Bailey Doloff, of Sykesville, MD and *Wishlea Star Dasher* won the \$10,000 NAL Children's Jumper Final, Presented by EquiFit, at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show.

This year, 29 riders came to compete for the honors of the \$10,000 NAL Children's Jumper Final, presented by EquiFit. The first round included 11 numbered elements and 14 jumping efforts. Only 12 riders made it through round 1 fault-free, advancing them to the jump-off. Out of the twelve, seven completed clear rounds again, leaving it up to the clock to determine the winner. The top four runs were separated by only a mere second, with Doloff taking the lead with 30.331 seconds.

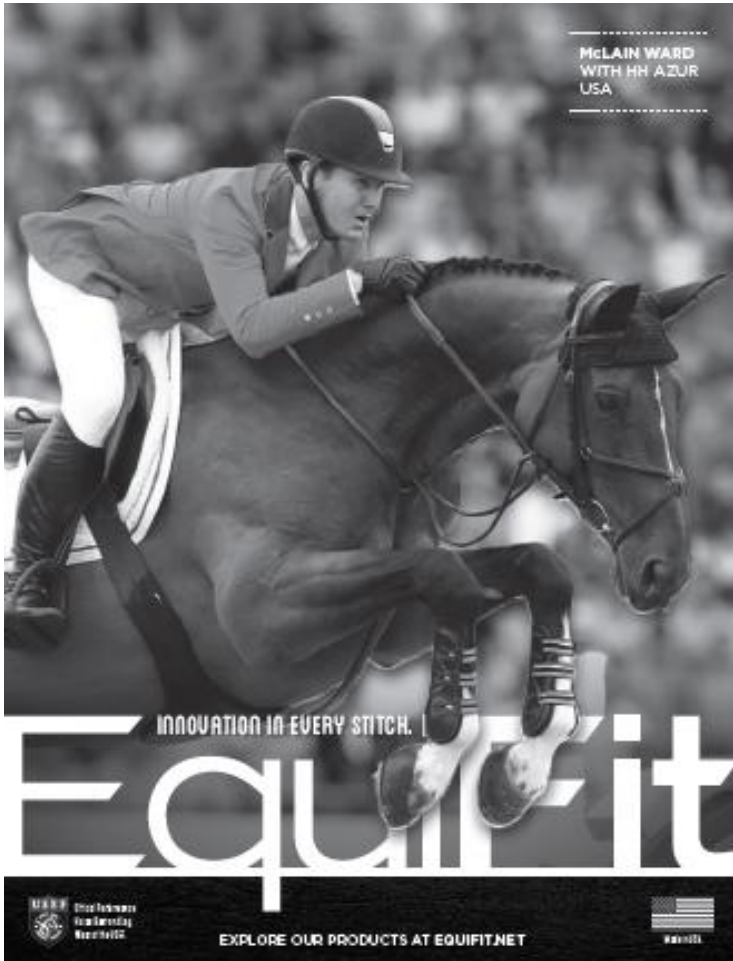
Second place was awarded to Hailey Berger of Parkland, FL aboard *Shannondale* with a time of 30.735 and third place went to Sarah Boston of Owings Mills, MD riding *Herminas* with a time of 31.207.

The partnership between Doloff and *Wishlea Star Dasher* began three years ago when Doloff's mother, Tamara, was in search of a pony for him to play around with. "He is a freak, I don't know how else to describe him," said Doloff. "When we first got him, he wasn't like this. It took him a while and finally this year he has come into his own and he puts everything he has into it in every class we have gone in. We got him to do pony racing. We realized that he could jump so we put him into a real program."

Doloff started riding when he was 7 and began taking formal lessons with Jamey Prettyman at Pickwick Stables. He and his brother shared a large pony, *Tickle My Fancy*, during that first year. As a senior at Glenelg Country School in Maryland, Doloff is applying to colleges with hopes of majoring in Sports Psychology.

Though riding takes up most of his free time, he enjoys other riding activities outside of horse showing such as foxhunting with the Green Spring Valley Hounds and participating in Hunter Paces and Hunter Trials. He has also been his school's IEA team captain for the past three years.

Along with winning the NAL Final, Doloff and Dasher have a long list of accomplishments from this past year. He was Champion in the Pony Jumpers at Devon, won Individual Gold at Pony Finals and received Team Silver and Individual Bronze at the Zone 3/Zone 4 High Children's Championship as well as receiving the Maryland Horse Industry Board's "Touch of Class" Award that was presented at the Washington International Horse Show.

National Finals at Pennsylvania National

Samantha Ruttura and *Quinn* Won The \$10,000 NAL Adult Hunter Final

Samantha Ruttura of Lloyd Harbor, NY and her horse *Quinn* won the \$10,000 NAL Adult Hunter Final along with the Lisa A.H. Cudahy Perpetual Trophy at Pennsylvania National Horse Show.

Out of a starting field of 30 horses, only four riders managed to score in the 80s. In her first round, Ruttura and *Quinn* landed in second place with a score of 86. The pair then scored an 81, giving them a two-round score of 167 moving them into first place to take the win.

Second place went to Melanie Jeanes, winner of last year's Final, of Dallas, TX aboard *Carerra* with a two-round score of 166 points and third place went to Helen Voss of Versailles, KY and *Proseco 24* with a score of 158 points.

“It was really exciting,” Ruttura explained. “He is a new horse for me, I only got him in April. He’s been a dream to get to know. He is very quiet with a big stride so once I figure out the right pace, everything seems to work out. We keep forgetting that he is only 8. He has such a good brain and we get along really well, which is most important to me.”

Ruturra and 8-year-old *Quinn* haven’t shown much but she was thrilled to qualify for the NAL Finals which she had never attended before. She chose the NAL because,

“It’s one of the few shows of this caliber that have 3’ divisions. Finding a big indoor show with this class was great, but I hadn’t expected to actually win.

“The NAL Finals was only our 9th horse show,” Ruttura continued. “I’ve been lucky to have a lot of success and great learning experiences all summer and fall. Going into the NAL Finals I just wanted to have consistent and confident rides. To make it even more special, Melanie Jeanes (who placed second) and I met and became friendly at Capital Challenge. With a big hug, she told me I won before we got back on to ride for ribbons. I am grateful for the lifelong friends I’ve made while horse showing, that doesn’t happen in most sports.”

When discussing her experience Ruttura said, “I am a true amateur with a full time normal job so I don’t get out to ride nearly as much as I would like. I am excited about what the future is going to bring. It has been a dream since I got him. I am so lucky to have him.”

During her free time Ruttura loves to travel and spend time with friends and family. She recently moved back to New York to be closer to family and owns and runs a construction equipment rental company on Long Island. She has also been spending much time in Pennsylvania with her show horses at Derbydown and semi-retired mare, *Limone* and foal at Horizon Hill Hunter Breeding.

Alexandra Cain and *Camille* Won The \$10,000 NAL Children's Hunter Final

Alexandra Cain of Olney, MD and *Camille* won the \$10,000 North American League (NAL) Children's Hunter Final and was also awarded the coveted Laura Palmer Picket Memorial Perpetual Trophy at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show.

From a field of 30 horses, 12 were invited back to the ring for the second round. Although Cain ranked fourth after the first round with a score of 78, her second round, with a score of 83.5, landed her in first place with a total of 161.50.

Hope Rutter of York, PA and *Cordelanne* took home second place with a score of 161.25 and third place was earned by Kayla Wolfe of Burke, VA and *Weekend Affaire* with a score of 160.75.

"In the first round I felt really confident," said Cain. "Then when everyone was doing so well I got a little uneasy. I knew I had to pull it together and not be nervous for the second round. It was all about quieting my nerves, because with her if I get nervous she gets really tense. So it really helps her if I am in my calm place."

Cain started riding *Camille* last November and had the opportunity to show her for the season. Cain expressed how it was one of the most amazing things ever to happen to her. "It was my first show season really seriously competing so to even make it this far is a big accomplishment for me. So my goal was just to make it to indoors and have fun. This just really adds to it," explained Cain.

Camille's owner, Laura Primm, has already approved Cain riding her again next season. She still has to make a plan which events they will compete in, but Cain will have the same goal in mind.

"That is my life – *Camille* and school. I love her so much," said Cain.

West Coast Finals at Las Vegas National

Hannah Ellerbrock and Lagos Won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper Final

Hannah Ellerbrock of Escondido, CA and Lagos, won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper Final at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.

Out of a starting field of 25 horses, the duo was the only combination to produce a clear round in the jump-off along with having the fastest time of 32.583 seconds. Second place was awarded to Michael Williamson of San Diego, CA aboard Caballo Farm, LLC's horse, Gucci, with a time of 35.971 seconds and four faults. Third place went to Lauren Hite of Coto De Caza, CA riding Chapot Z with 8 faults and a time of 36.810 seconds.

“I think the most important part was to be double clean. It was a jump-off of only three but I knew that the other two riders were pretty clean riders and wicked fast,” said Ellerbrock. “We went ahead and galloped right around hoping to put in a solid double clear and it ended up paying off for us.”

Ellerbrock began riding when she was five after her parents let her go on a pony ride. Since then, she has never looked back. Taking care of and showing her horse, Lagos, is a family affair and one of her biggest achievements. After moving Lagos to her parents' house, her parents helped split stall cleaning and feeding while Ellerbrock is solely responsible for grooming, arena maintenance, vet and farrier scheduling, and more – all on top of having a full-time job!

Ellerbrock works at Organovo Inc., where she works on 3D bioprinting human tissue for toxicology testing and working towards eventual therapeutic applications. In her free time, she is studying computer programming to help make her more competitive for PhD programs in the future. One of her favorite things to do is read. She is currently working on *Gene* by Siddhartha Mukherjee.

For the past six years, Ellerbrock has been training with Hap Hansen, Trudi Fletcher and Christine Praefke at Hap Hansen Stables in Rancho Santa Fe, CA. In the four years she was at college, she split her time riding with Hap Hansen Stables in the summer and Darlene Sandlin in Canastota, NY during the school year.

When asked what she likes most about jumper classes, she said, “I love the adrenaline that comes with competing in the jumper classes. My horse always comes out really wanting to win, which means we can take some risks in jump-offs. I love being able to have fun in the jump-offs and test myself with some inside turns and big gallops.”

Ellerbrock stated that she would like to bring light to how much work and dedication come from so many people to get one horse-and-rider team ready for a competition. “The team aspect of this sport extends well beyond just the horse and rider,” Ellerbrock said. “I am incredibly thankful for every person who has worked so hard to get Lagos and me to the point where we could go into the ring. I feel very lucky to be part of the team that I have!”

West Coast Finals at Las Vegas National

Lexi Mulkey and *Warnike* Won The \$5,000 NAL Adult Jumper Final, Presented by SmartPak

Lexi Mulkey of Broken Arrow, OK and *Warnike* won the \$5,000 NAL Adult Jumper Final, Presented by SmartPak at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.



Caroline Spogli of San Diego, CA clinched the next two spots with double clear rounds aboard both her mounts. She took second place aboard Cavallo Farms LLC's *Zeppelie*, who had a jump-off time of 31.294 seconds, and third place with Cavallo Farms LLC's *Nakano RB* with a jump-off time of 32.681 seconds.

"I wasn't sure if I wanted to do the inside turns because there were options," stated Mulkey. "But I know my horse and she is faster if you just let her go."

This year, 23 horses were entered to compete in the Final. Only 7 riders advanced to the jump-off where it was left to the timer to determine the top three placings. Mulkey and *Warnike* finished with a winning time of 31.015 seconds.

"I have owned *Warnike* since February," Mulkey said about her mount. "She is one of my favorite horses that I have ever had. She is very hot, catty and feisty. She loves to win just as much as I do and I think that's why we make such a good pair."

Mulkey was introduced to horses by a childhood friend, but wasn't able to start riding until she was at least 8 because of her small size. She began competing in the NAL classics in 2011, starting with Children's Hunter, and started competing at indoors in 2012.

Megan Ghere trained Mulkey for six years until she was turned over to Andy Kocher, who is based out of Ocala, FL, this past February.

Mulkey stated that one of the biggest challenges in preparing for the Finals is being a full-time student. Also, having her horse half-way across the country makes it difficult to prepare for shows. "Typically, my first and second classes of the week are me just trying to get back into it," Mulkey said.

One of Mulkey's goals is to compete internationally one day as well as compete in the U25 Division. "This win in the NAL Finals was an amazing boost for me and my mare," Mulkey explained. "I think in regards to my career in the jumpers, it is one of my top accomplishments."

When she isn't at the barn, Mulkey attends Oklahoma State University where she is a sophomore and loves going to Oklahoma State football games.

Children's Jumper Presented by EquiFit

West Coast Finals at Las Vegas National

Tali DeJong and *Amadeus* Won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Children's Jumper Final, Presented by EquiFit

Tali DeJong of Golden, CO and *Amadeus*, won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Children's Jumper Final, presented by EquiFit at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.

With four entries making it to the jump-off, DeJong and *Amadeus* produced two double clear rounds and the fastest jump-off time of 29.127 seconds to clinch the win. Romina Fimbres of San Diego, CA and her own horse, *Bea von Herten*, who also jumped double-clear rounds, took reserve champion with a jump-off time of 33.726 seconds and Tori Weisman of San Diego, CA and her horse, *Avident*, took third place with 8 faults in the jump-off and a time of 44.122 seconds.

"My jumper and I just flew over all of the jumps," smiled De Jong. "It was a fun, fun show and a super fun course!"

Amadeus is a new mount for DeJong, purchasing him this past August. "I just love his heart," DeJong said about her partner. "He is super sweet on the ground and he just wants to cuddle most of the time. The great thing about him is that he gives me confidence riding up to any jump."

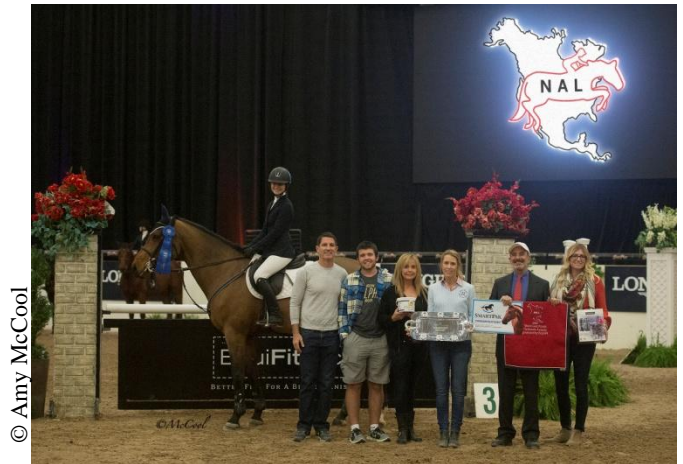
DeJong has always loved horses and began riding when she saw her sister beginning to take lessons. She began focusing on the NAL this year. When her sister started college last year, DeJong took over riding her jumper horse after having competed mostly in hunters and equitation.

One of DeJong's biggest achievements as a rider was winning the \$25,000 USHJA International Hunter Derby this year on her other horse, *Spero*. Her next goal is to qualify for the FEI North American Junior and Young Riders Championships.

Many people have contributed to DeJong's success so far. She began riding with Angel Pitton in Las Vegas, NV and has also trained with Susie Hutchison after purchasing *Amadeus*. "Jim Hangman helped me at the Las Vegas National Horse Show," DeJong stated. "I have been training with him for a number of years now.

Outside the show I have received a lot of help from Rob Gage, Tracye Ferguson and Debbie Bergman." When she isn't spending time in the saddle or in the barn, DeJong attends Stanford Online High School and enjoys reading.

"I would like to thank the NAL for the great Championship classes," she said. "Particularly for the fact that the NAL added the West Coast Finals in the last few years as it is hard for many of us, and our horses, to travel back East."

West Coast Finals at Las Vegas National

Tonia Cook-Looker and *Paddington* Won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Adult Hunter Final

Tonia Cook-Looker of San Dimas, CA and *Paddington*, won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Adult Hunter Final at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.

Out of a starting field of 17 horses, 12 returned to the ring for a second round. Cook-Looker and *Paddington* were the only team to score in the 80s for both rounds with an 83 in round one and an 87 in round two for a total score of 170. Cook-Looker also took home second place aboard *Wallace* with a score of 159 and third place went to Polly Sweeney of Los Angeles, CA riding Ann Russo's horse, *Ideal*, placing just two points below second place.

“It was a big honor to be able to ride in the class and I’ve looked forward to riding in it all year long,” exclaimed Cook-Looker. “Paddington, who ended up being Champion, is my daughter Lexi Looker’s horse and she was nice enough this year to loan me the horse to be able to try to qualify for the NAL Finals so I worked very hard.”

One of Cook-Looker’s biggest obstacles in preparing for the NAL Final was to make sure that both Paddington and Wallace were prepared for showing indoors. “The warm-up arena is small and always filled with horses, so practicing is a little challenging,” Cook-Looker stated. “This was Wallace’s first time showing or being ridden in an indoor ring, so I wanted to make sure he was comfortable in the different environment.”

Cook-Looker is an accountant and manager of her farm, Woodland Oaks Ranch, where her horses reside. She meets up with many different trainers while at horse shows including Jamie Taylor, Mark Bone, Rose Carver, Tasha Visokay, Don Stewart and Bibby Farmer Hill.

Currently, her biggest achievement in her riding career is winning USEF Horse of the Year with *Winfield* in the 3’3” 36 & over Amateur-Owner division in 2014. In the future, she hopes to further *Wallace*’s career in the Amateur-Owner ring since this was only his first year showing with an Amateur.

“I’m very grateful and fortunate to have had the opportunity to have such wonderful horses that allow me to compete at this level,” Cook-Looker said, “as well as the constant support from my family and trainers who help make our team a success.”

West Coast Finals at Las Vegas National

Ariana Marnell and *Imagination* Won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Children's Hunter Final

Ariana Marnell of Las Vegas, NV and *Imagination* won the \$5,000 NAL West Coast Children's Hunter Final at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.

At only nine-years-old, Marnell was the only rider to score in the 80s in both rounds to take first place with a score of 163. Stella Wasserman of Beverly Hills, CA took second place riding *Fine Design* with a total of 154 and third place went to Emilie Bell of Elk Grove, CA riding *Bulletproof Picasso* with a total of 151. This year's hunter judges were Patricia Griffith of New York and Scott Fitton of Florida.

"I feel really proud, I feel really happy with my ride," smiled Marnell. "I thank my trainer for keeping me in the game the whole time."
