Year-End Review 2020

The North American League (NAL) concluded its 2019-2020 season with National Finals held this year during the Capital Challenge Horse Show at the World Equestrian Center in Wilmington, OH.

Finals were held in each of the League's five divisions – Children's Hunter presented by Copper Fox LLC, Adult Hunter presented by Monkey Business LLC, Children's Jumper presented by EquiFit, Adult Jumper presented by SmartPak and Low Junior/Amateur Jumper presented by Horseflight.

The NAL offers year-long Series in each of these five divisions. Those who accumulate the most points in their divisions over the course of the season earn the right to ride in the year-end Finals as well as recognition as the season's Division champions.

Each of this year's Finals featured \$10,000 prize money and all participants received gift bags. Each winner received additional prizes including gift certificates generously donated by EquiFit, SmartPak and The Clothes Horse, NAL coolerette and a commemorative glass bowl. The Finals' hunter courses were designed by Ken Krome and jumper courses were designed by Joe Carnicom.

Low Junior/Amateur Jumper Division Presented by Horseflight



National and West and Finals Champion Dominic Gibbs

Dominic Gibbs had a highly successful 2019-2020 NAL season, riding Douwe to the top of both the West and National standings in the Low Junior/Amateur Jumper Division Presented by Horseflight, and then adding a win in the NAL Finals at the Capital Challenge. Just a few weeks after his win in the Finals, Dominic ended his year with a win in the ASPCA Maclay National Championship!

Dominic, a high school senior at Score Academy who started riding at age 10, has been with Douwe for two years. Owned by his coaches, Katie and Henri Prudent, the 12-year-old, KWPN gelding is, "The fastest jumper I've ever ridden. He has barrel racer turns!

"The win in the NAL Finals was really exciting. It was my last show on him before my sister took over the reins so I wanted to make it meaningful. It was such a competitive jump-off. It had some of the best horses in the country, but I knew I had one of

the fastest. I knew I could take a chance and take some tough inside turns that maybe some of the other horses and riders wouldn't be able to do. Douwe makes my job really easy and fun!

"I owe so much to my parents because they believe in me unconditionally. My mom has the attitude that anything is possible. My dad has a work ethic like no one else, and with that he's achieved great things.

"I'd also like to thank Katie and Henri for allowing me to ride Douwe, and their endless patience in bringing me along through the lowest levels to where I am now, in just two years. I also thank them for introducing me to Stacia Klein Madden, who has also shaped and changed my life. My coaches have opened doors for me, found horses for me nd always believed in me even when mistakes are made. \$10,000 Finals Champion Ellen Halle

Emerging victorious in the NAL Adult Jumper Final Presented by SmartPak, was Ellen Halle of Upperco, MD, with Iggy Pop, who completed the jump-off in a time of 34.01 seconds. Ellen topped the field of 27 entries and took on the short course with nine other competitors, ultimately taking home the horse show's Leading Adult Jumper Rider title, as well.

"The jump-off was icing on the cake for me," Ellen said of her win. The winning pair were matched together in March of this year, and this was Ellen's first ever Final. "I took a long time off from riding – probably ten years – and really only started showing competitively again this year. I spent some time living abroad, where I did ride which was quite the experience. Now I'm doing my MBA and Master's in Public Policy and am in my final year.

"This was definitely worth the trip, and I was super grateful to be there and to be part of a competition with such high caliber athletes," added Ellen who trains with Troy Hendricks of Kimber View. "They really went the extra mile to make it a great experience for all the exhibitors."

Stephanie King rode Lexus to first place in the National Standings of the NAL Adult Jumper Division Presented by SmartPak.

Stephanie, who began riding at a young age, has had great success in the NAL. This year marked her 4th time competing in the NAL Finals and the second consecutive year that she was the year-end high point winner. She accomplished the feat last year on Co-Starr before doing it this year on Lexus, the 16-year old, Swedish Warmblood gelding whom she owns. "He's probably the most genius horse I've ever ridden," Stephanie said. "We swear he reads the numbers on the jumps!"

Stephanie trains with Brooke and Chad Watridge of Ridgewater Show Stables based in St. Augustine, Florida. "I've been with them now about five years and they are truly the best friends, horse managers, and trainers one could ask for."

Stephanie typically rides her three horses six times a week when home and she loves, "taking on new challenges. Each of my horses is different and needs different types of exercises and rides to keep them at their best. I enjoy being able to adapt and adjust to their needs while learning new skills along the way.

\$10,000 Finals Champion Leigh Nanda

In the NAL Children's Jumper Final presented by EquiFit, Leigh Nanda dominated the competition with her horse El Casper, accomplishing a perfect show after also taking the win in the Welcome the day before.

Leigh, who trains with Lance Williamson of Gurney, Illinois, emerged victorious in every class of the week, also earning the horse show's Leading Children's Jumper Rider award.

The 15-year-old from Wilmette, IL, bested a 21-horse jump-off, crossing the timers in 31.488 seconds. Twenty-nine riders took on the course, with 16 jumping double-clear efforts which meant that time was going to be the deciding factor.

"I took a stride out in the first line and the last line, so I think that really did it for me," Leigh said of her winning round. "Casper takes a lot of leg; he looks and feels deceptively slow, but he's got a really big Part TTB-33, 44 T C C Sean Metillar 20

stride. He's really smooth if you meet all the jumps in stride. My trainer always says, 'Smooth is fast!'

"He's a really sweet horse," Leigh added about her 13-year-old partner with whom she's been paired for less than four months. "After I ride him, he gets a little pumped up!"

Gabriella Curry rode Chaviana to the top of the National standings in the NAL Children's Jumper Division Presented by EquiFit.

The eighth grader from Plantation, Florida turned in an amazing season on her 14-year old KWPN mare owned by Alex Javne of Our Day Farm. Among her year's highlights with Chaviana were winning the last Classic at the Winter Equestrian Festival in Wellington, finishing as Reserve Champion there in the High Children's Jumper Division (14 and under) and riding in last summer's Equifest Series at Lamplight in Wayne, Illinois where they were fault-free and the top 3 in every class over three weeks!

\$10,000 Finals Champion Kendall Meijer

Kendall Meijer of Grand Rapids, MI, rode Elliot to the win in the NAL Adult Hunter Final presented by Monkey Business LLC. A field of 28 contested the Final, with the top 12 returning in reverse order of their standings to jump a second round.

A score of 87 in the first round put Kendall and Elliot at the top of the leaderboard; a second-round score of 84.75 for a 171.75 total cemented the pair's victory.

"Each course rode really smoothly, and I thought the jumps were beautiful. They were not too exotic, so they really gave the chance to show the smoothness and quality that a good adult hunter is supposed to have. It's so fun; I've done this class the last 10 years or so, and I was always a bridesmaid," said the 28-year-old who trains with Cathy and Hilary Johnson. "I made the top 12 a few times, but to get a win on my seven-year-old was really special."

Kendall has had Elliot for the past year, and she jokes that the seven-yearold, grey, Selle Français gelding is, "Seven going on 17. I like a horse that's quiet and easy going, and he's just those things. He's very quiet which always works for me."

She has had great success with Indian Ocean, a 9-year-old, bay, Dutch Warmblood gelding, winning this year's Circuit Championship at HITS Ocala in the 46-55 Adult Hunters. Helping her to that title was a win in an Adult Hunter Classic with over 40 entries. "It was very exciting!"

Sandra, an attorney with Blue Cross Blue Shield, started riding horses when she was 8-years old and she started riding in the NAL Adult Hunter classes in 2019. At home, her trainer is Sherry Templin with whom she has been riding since about age 10. At the shows, her trainers are Craig Allen and Don Sheehan from Wayside Farm, located in Tennessee in the summer and Ocala in the winter. She has been training with them since 2017.

Sandra, who won the 2004 USEF National Horse of the Year title in the 3'6" Amateur-Owner (36 & over) division with her horse Rumors, usually only gets to ride once a week due to work obligations. She loves it and says, "My goal in life is to retire early enough to still be able to ride competitively. It is my goal to be able to compete successfully in the NAL and WIHS Finals in 2021 and work towards moving up to the AO 3'3" division with Indian Ocean.

\$10,000 Finals Champion Luke Rinehart

Luke Rinehart of Westfield, IN, rode Cavalli, a 15-year-old Hanoverian gelding owned by Taylor Johnson, to the win in the NAL Children's Hunter Final presented by Copper Fox LLC. Luke was one of 29 to contest the class and the 13-year-old from Indiana led the class from beginning to end after earning a score of 86.50 in the first round and an 86.00 in the second round, for a 172.50 total.

"I did not think coming in that I would be first!" said Luke, who trains with his parents, Richard and Catherine. "I thought I'd get more like the top 12 – maybe sixth or seventh – so I was very excited about how it turned out. It feels fantastic. I thought my first round was probably the better of the two rounds. It was a good, solid round, and I was a lot more nervous coming into the second round.

"Cavalli's a great horse," he continued. "He has a lot of professional training and experience. I've had him for a while now, between two and three years. My small pony got lame and Taylor was looking to lease him, so we got him and we were very excited. I'm so lucky to have him. I'm really thankful for him, for my family and for everyone who helped out – the Johnson family, Taylor, and all my horse show friends!"
