Rules & Regulations

- Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted in accordance therewith.
- Should any question or dispute arise which is not provided for in the rules, the decision of show management and the show committee will be final.
- All over fences classes will be judged under open numerical scoring.
- Junior and Amateur Owner Hunters will be jogged for soundness in all over fences classes.
- **QUALIFYING:** Entries for the Zone 2 Hunter Championship will be limited based on USHJA Zone 2 points earned by horses/ponies at no more than 15 shows starting on or after September 1, 2021 through shows starting on or before August 31, 2022. No rider may ride more than two entries in any section. The champion from 2021 will be guaranteed acceptance in its respective section, provided it was entered and paid office/qualifying fee by the closing date of entries.
- Entries must have earned at least one point in their section to be eligible for the Zone 2 Hunter Championship. Horse and rider must be recorded in Zone 2 and points count only from Zone 2.
- **ACCEPTANCE:** Qualifying lists will be posted at www.ryegate.com. Acceptance letters will be sent no later than September 26th. Preferred method will be via email. Hard copy will only be sent if no other method is available. Letters will be sent by annettel@ryegate.com, please make sure to add this as a safe sender to your email.
- **ELIGIBILITY:** There are no cross entry restrictions with Pennsylvania National Horse Show for 2022.
- **CLOSING DATE:** Entries must be entered online or postmarked before midnight EDT on September 5, 2022. Should an entry bear both a postage meter date and postmark by the Post Office Department, the Post Office date will be considered the effective date of mailing. Should an entry bear a postage meter date and no Post Office Department postmark, the metered date shall be valid only if received within seven days of the date shown. Entries sent via courier service must be entered into the courier's system by the courier's representative before midnight on the date shown above to be considered on time. A date and/or time entered on the waybill by the sender is not considered the official date/time of sending. Dropping the entries into a courier pickup box does not constitute "postmark" until entered into the courier's system by their representative.
- **WAIT LIST & LATE ENTRIES:** A wait list of on time entries will be established in order of points. Should there be declines from the accepted entries, the Zone 2 Hunter Championship will proceed down the wait list in order. If the qualifying lists are exhausted and spaces are still available in accordance with entry quotas, the Zone 2 Hunter Championship reserves the right to accept late entries in the order of postmark for all sections.
- **QUALIFYING & ENTRY FEE:** A non-refundable qualifying fee of \$50 will be charged to each entry. All divisions entry fees will be \$280, stalls are \$200 for the entirety of the show, USEF/USHJA fees of \$25 for each horse will be invoiced with acceptance. Full payment of accepted horses is due by October 10th. Make checks payable to Ryegate Show Services.
- **STALLS:** All stalls are temporary, vinyl, approximately 10x10, with doors, housed in permanent buildings. Tack/grooming stalls are available at \$200 per stall. Stalls will be available from 2:00 pm Friday and must be vacated by midnight Sunday. Anyone needing to deviate from this must contact the show in advance.
- **RETURNED CHECKS:** There will be a \$75 charge for any returned check.
- **ARRIVAL:** Upon arrival, exhibitors must check in with the Stabling Office and the Zone 2 Horse Show Office. Exhibitors must use stalls assigned for Zone 2 by the stable manager. **Use of unauthorized stalls will incur an additional charge.**
- **REFUNDS/SCRATCH FEE:** Full payment for accepted horses is due by October 10th. Declines or scratches received before October 10th will receive a full refund of entry fee. Office/qualifying fee is non-refundable. Scratches received on or after October 10th, but before October 17th, will receive a refund less a \$50 scratch fee if accompanied by a signed licensed veterinarian scratch. The remaining entry fee will be refunded within thirty (30) days of the conclusion of the Zone 2 Hunter Championship. No refunds will be issued for scratches received on or after October 17th for any reason.

Rules & Regulations Continued

- **SCHOOLING:** Exhibitors must wear their number while in the ring, including during schooling. Riding will be permitted in each arena the morning of the competition, for FLAT WORK only. See Schooling Schedule for times. **No Jumping will be permitted.** No horse or pony in the Zone 2 Hunter Championship may be ridden in any schooling area if a Pennsylvania National Horse Show class is occurring in the respective showing ring. Any horse or pony found in violation will be eliminated from the competition.
- **RIBBONS:** Eight ribbons will be awarded in all performance classes.
- **DOGS:** Dogs are not permitted on the premises unless restrained on a leash. **NO DOGS ARE PERMITTED IN THE SEATING AREAS OR THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE.**
- **CREDENTIALS:** Every owner, trainer and rider must present proof of current USEF and USHJA membership and horse recording. All low children' ponies, children's ponies and junior hunters must present proof of a current USEF Measurement card.
- **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** A Negative Coggins Test dated within one year is required for each entry. All horses on the grounds must comply with and provide proof of vaccinations per USEF GR845. Any additional Health Requirements will be sent with acceptance letters. To expedite processing upon your arrival at the show, please send a copy with your entry blank or acknowledgment. **NO NUMBERS WILL BE RELEASED FROM OFFICE WITHOUT PROOF OF COGGINS OR VACCINATION.**

The Farm Show Complex is located at the junction of North Cameron and Maclay Streets, 2300 N. Cameron St., Harrisburg, PA 17101.

Long Island, NY: Merge onto I 295 North via Exit 33 towards Bronx/New England.

I-295 North becomes I-95 South. Follow I-95 S Express Lanes toward I-80. Remain on I-95 South to I-78 West. Follow I-78 toward Harrisburg. Exit I-81 South onto Cameron Street and follow signs to Farm Show Complex. Approx. 195 miles from Great Neck, NY.

New York, NY: Holland Tunnel to 14th Street becomes US-1 and 9/US-9S/US-1S. Take I-78 West express toward Garden State Parkway. Merge onto I-81S. Exit I-81 South onto Cameron Street and follow signs to Farm Show Complex. Approx. 170 miles.

Philadelphia, PA: West on I-76 toward Valley Forge. Merge onto I-283N via Exit 257 toward Harrisburg/Hershey. I-283 N becomes I-83N/US-322W. Merge onto I-81S. Exit I-81 South onto Cameron Street and follow signs to Farm Show Complex. Approx. 110 miles.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
